

World Diabetes Day – Blue for Diabetes Day – 14th November

On Tuesday 14th November children are invited to dress up in Blue for World Diabetes Day. We ask for a small donation. All donations will go to JDRF (Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation). On the day, the children will attend a whole school assembly and complete activities based around Type 1 diabetes. Donations can be made via School Hub or placed in the bucket in the morning.

Children in Need/St Joseph's Children's Home/Red Wednesday – 17th November

We recognise that Children in Need is a national event, and many children and families want to take part in their fundraising activities. However, when giving money to a large body like Children in Need, children do not always see how the funds they raise benefit other people. As a Catholic school, we are encouraged to look for Catholic charities that support similar aims to national charities and provide resources to help children understand charitable giving as part of the Catholic character of our school. As a Catholic school, we teach about charity as a virtue, a habit we want to develop because it makes for rounded individuals. We encourage children to fundraise not just for fun, but because their charitable gifts help to make the world a better place for others. Therefore, instead of raising money for Children in Need, we will raise funds for St Joseph's Children's Home in India. The children's home (church and school) was set up by Fr Ajish (our Assistant Priest). Fr Ajish and parishioners visit St Joseph's on a regular basis and pupils will be able to see the impact their fundraising and charitable gifts have on the children's lives - children who are less fortunate than them. Photographs and videos will be shared with our pupils. Children can come to school in nonuniform and make donations via the bucket or School Hub. Children are asked to wear the colour red as it is often worn to celebrate St Joseph's feast day
