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General News:		
<p>Swimming Year 3 will be swimming next half term.</p> <p>World Book Day – Friday 8th March This year the theme is Diversity so we are all reading 'Mixed' by Arree Chung. "This is a funny, vibrantly illustrated tale that celebrates individual differences and talents and has an inspiring message about understanding, acceptance and peaceful co-existence." On the day we will share the book and then the children will participate in activities such as poetry writing and performance, singing, and art. <u>We ask that your child comes dressed head to toe in one colour on the day.</u> This will then be the colour they are known as all day. Face paint is allowed if you wish.</p> <p>Attendance Our attendance continues to be below national figures and our school is being monitored by our Trust. We ask for your support in improving attendance by sending your child to school on a daily basis, where possible.</p> <p>Attendance - Action Plans All pupils with an attendance of less than 90%, unless there is a valid medical reason with medical evidence, have been placed on an action plan. Letters and action plans have been shared with parents via ClassDojo.</p> <p>Attendance - Welfare Visits We recently reviewed attendance for pupils with attendance below 80% and after half term we will be reviewing attendance for pupils with an attendance between 80-90%. Where attendance has not improved and absences continue, we have a statutory duty of care to the child. Therefore, we will be carrying out home visits. We ask that parents do not take offence to this, and invite us into their home. Once we have had sight of the child/ren and have spoken to parents we will be on our way.</p> <p>Parking We recently received an email from an upset local resident. Parking access to their home (and other residents) in St Francis Garden is blocked on a regular basis. On a few occasions the resident has reported that they have been screamed at and verbally abused. The wording in their complaint was, 'All of this behaviour reflects badly on the school and such behaviour does not correspond with the school's ethos.' Therefore, please remember to park safely, politely and respectfully. If needed, park a little further away from school where there is more space and walk with your child to school. If you are local, we would encourage you to walk, rather than drive to school. Thank you for your anticipated cooperation.</p>	<p>School Lunches Please remember to order a lunch for your child on School Hub before 9.30am. We regularly have children without a lunch ordered. If you have any problems, please ring the school office.</p> <p>Behaviour – 1, 2, 3 At St Pius X, we pride ourselves on good behaviour. In a recent assembly, we discussed our whole school 1, 2, 3 strategy and with the children's help we have made a few improvements to ensure consistency across the school. We had children model it at the front and the other children marked them out of 10. Our updated 1, 2, 3 strategy can be found on ClassDojo and on our school Facebook page.</p> <p>Dogs This is a polite reminder that dogs are NOT allowed on school grounds, even if carried.</p> <p>ClassDojo Rewards Before Christmas, we consulted with parents about ClassDojo rewards. Staff have now discussed and agreed consistent rewards (available to view on ClassDojo and our Facebook page) that have been pushed out to all classes.</p> <p>School Catering Contract Recently, our Trust went out to tender for a new catering contractor. As a result, on 1st April 2024, the school will be changing its catering provider from the current supplier to Caterlink. As part of the change, we will be moving our cashless payment system to a new provider called Schoolcomms. The system used to order food will also change to a system called Cypad (part of Schoolcomms). During the coming weeks, information and set up instructions will be sent to you in anticipation of the move. Any credit balances in the account for your child on 31st March will be carried over into the new system on April 1st. Any balances that are outstanding must be settled before transferring over to the new system.</p> <p>SEND Coffee Morning The next meeting will on Monday 26th February at 9:15-10:30am. <p>Contact Details If your contact details have changed (phone numbers, address, contacts, etc), please ring the school office to update.</p> <p>Prompt Collection Parents are reminded that school finishes at 3:25pm and children must be collected promptly. Staff have meetings and extra-curricular clubs to get to. If your child is not collected by 3:35pm then they will be placed in After School Club and a charge of £3 per child will be applied to your School Hub account. If collected after 4pm then the full charge of £5.50 will be applied.</p> <p>Staff Well-being – Emails and ClassDojo We are lucky to have such a dedicated and enthusiastic staff team. Therefore, we are keen to ensure we protect our staff and look after their well-being. We are encouraging teachers to only access emails and ClassDojo between the hours of 7.30am and 5.30pm (week days and term time only). Support staff are contracted differently and are not expected to respond to emails and ClassDojo outside of their working hours. Therefore, we ask parents to be respect this and not expect an immediate response. We ask you to consider the day and time before contacting staff on ClassDojo or via email.</p>	<p>Breakfast Club Drop Off & After School Collection Breakfast Club starts at 7:30am - do not arrive any earlier as staff are not employed until that time. After School Club finishes at 5:30pm promptly. Staff are contracted until this time. If children are collected later than 5:30pm then a late collection charge of £4 per child will be added to School Hub to cover additional staff costs.</p> <p>Free School Meals If you think you may be entitled to Free School Meals, please follow the link below. All children in the infants (Reception to Year 2) are entitled to Universal Free School Meals but it is important for other funding that you apply for Free School Meals if you are entitled.
